A part of an international women's organization, Na'amat Canada is a registered Canadian charity. Since Na'amat Canada's inception in 1925 our mission has been dedicated to enhancing the quality of life of women, children, youth and families in Israel and in Canada.

Na'amat Canada Raises Funds

To Maintain:

- ♦ 260 Daycare Centres servicing 18,000 children, infants through preschoolers, including extended care daycares for children with special needs
- ♦ 14 Technological High Schools and 2 Agricultural Residential High Schools for hard-to-reach teens
- ♦ 30 Legal Aid Bureaus and 5 Women's Rights Centres that provide legal advice and representation for 10,000 women annually. This includes legal guidance relating to employment, divorce, marriage, single parenting and other issues.
- ♦ A combined Shelter and Counselling Centre for victims of domestic violence with a multi-purpose activity wing for child victims of family violence.
- ♦ University Scholarships for women in need, to pursue higher education
- ♦ Social services in Canada that mirror our important work in Israel, including charitable projects with local women's shelters

How Do Planned Gifts Help?

Planned gifts bequeathed to Na'amat Canada help to sustain a myriad of social services and projects in Israel. Generous donors who believe in bettering the lives of generations of Israeli women, children, youth and families help ensure our future.

How Does The Donor Benefit?

1) A bequest to Na'amat Canada may serve to reduce, by means of a tax credit, the income tax payable by the donors' estate. A planned gift may eliminate or reduce tax on capital gains.

2) The Income Tax Act sets the upper limit on the credit that an individual can claim annually on donations at 75% of net income from all sources and 100% in the year prior to, and including the year of death.

3) In 2006, the Canadian government eliminated the capital gains tax on donations of public listed securities to charitable organizations.



Planned Giving is accessible to everyone. Once you have assured the financial security of your loved ones, you can fulfill a legacy to help the future of Israel by supporting a cause that you hold dear.

Bequest

Make a donation to Na'amat Canada by adding a distinct clause or codicil to your will or by including Na'amat Canada as a beneficiary in your will. This donation will reduce the taxes payable by your heirs.

Life Insurance

Donate, bequeath or subscribe to an insurance policy with Na'amat Canada listed as the beneficiary. This provides both immediate and long-term tax benefits, as well as the satisfaction of leaving a significant sum of money to perpetuate the vital work we do in Israel.

Securities

Transfer stocks or bonds to Na'amat Canada and receive a donation receipt based on the value of the security on the day it is transferred to Na'amat Canada, resulting in savings in capital gains tax.

Annuities and Charitable Trusts

Subscribe to an annuity or create a charitable trust with Na'amat Canada as the beneficiary. The annuity, like the charitable trust, guarantees you income tax credits and a regular income throughout your life. On your death, the capital is turned over to Na'amat Canada.

Property or Material Assets

Donate a building, cottage, artwork, jewellery, or other assets and benefit from an income tax receipt to reduce your capital gains. (An independent evaluation will be required to establish the fair market value for property or item).

RRSPs and RRIFs

Name Na'amat Canada as the beneficiary of your registered retirement savings plan, retirement income fund, or any surplus funds in your bank account upon your demise. As a result, your estate will receive a charitable donation tax receipt for the full amount of the gift.

Making a planned donation requires reflection and preparation. Na'amat Canada recommends that you consult a legal taxation or financial counsellor to carry out the most appropriate donation for your situation.
